The month culminated in our CHPs being recognised by the Chief Administrative Officer of Mbale District, Madam Nambozo, for their outstanding health work in the communities they support. Each of them were presented with certificates of appreciation.



Andrew's Bike Ride

On the 22nd - 27th June, Andrew Horne (a member of our fundraising committee) and 4 friends will be taking on a Coast-to-Coast Cycle Ride.

"Having witnessed first-hand the impact of the work undertaken by Spotlight on Africa, I decided to cycle from Seascale to Whitby - a total of 153 miles - with 4 friends to help raise money for a Maternity Centre in the district of Mbale, where women are 56 times more likely to die in childbirth than in the UK; heartbreakingly, this equates to 500 per 100,000"

The area has one of the highest Maternal Mortality Rates (MMR) in the World, so a Maternity Centre is desperately needed to help reduce it.
