During the first week back at school, 213 girls took part in menstrual hygiene classes and were supplied with packs of Afripad sanitary products. Due to period poverty, so many girls in Uganda have to use rags, old cloths or newspapers during their cycle. But now that they have the Afripad supplies, they will be able to attend school and concentrate in class without worrying about embarrassing
