MCS was our very first construction project in Uganda! Tailoring Graduate Updates

Our Economic Development programmes are such an important part of the way that we work, providing an opportunity for everyone in the community to transform their life. The team met with Carol, a recent tailoring graduate. She told them "I am so happy for the training I got with Spotlight on Africa. I am now employed in tailoring and the money I get has enabled me to take care of myself and my 6 year old son; I pay rent out of it and I also support my aging parents."



Esther's life has also been transformed since completing our tailoring course. She sells her tailoring products from home, supporting her family of 6. From her savings she has been able to buy a goat and a hen, which now has chicks!

These stories are testament to our Economic Development projects and it's incredibly humbling to see the huge impact they can have on individuals in these poorer communities.
