## PLANTING TREES AND SHRUBS

Pupils at Musoto Christian School have been learning about the importance of the natural world by planting new trees and shrubs around the school site. Trees and plants are vital contributors to the environment. They absorb carbon dioxide in the air; release oxygen via photosynthesis; filter pollutants in the air; and provide important habitats for wildlife.

But in areas like Bukasakya subcounty where we work, there are additional benefits. They help prevent flooding during the rainy season by absorbing stormwater; provide shade in the extreme heats; bear fruit - a valuable source of food for families who often go hungry; and have medicinal properties.



Fruit from the Anona tree is used locally to treat cancer. Conventional medicine is often unaffordable in these communities.



Roots of the Bathedavia trees repel mole rats that burrow in the school compound and cause damage to other plants.





The Alginia plant is also used medicinally for the treatment of skin diseases.



The Podocarpus tree is great for shade and also a powerful windbreaker. They have been placed strategically to protect the school from strong winds.

# UGANDA-UK HEALTH ALLIANCE NEWSLETTER

Dr Bethan Rees, Chair of Spotlight on Africa, was recently invited to write an article for the 2021 Uganda-UK Health Alliance Newsletter. She describes how the COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the importance of our healthcare work in Uganda. Outreach work through our Community Health Promoters is critical in engaging with communities that have become more isolated as a consequence of lockdown measures and the HSoA Ambulance Service is essential in bringing patients in need to the Health Centre.

In his foreword, Professor Ged Byrne (Co-Chair of the Uganda-UK Health Alliance) brings our attention to the challenges of a global vaccination rollout. He says "We are a long way short of overcoming the havoc and sadness that COVID19 has brought over the last year and a half but the emergence and rollout of at least 7 effective vaccines is providing hope of an end to a bleak time in our collective histories. At the time of writing more than 30 Million people have received at least one dose of a vaccine, which, whilst demonstrating how quickly such a programme can be delivered when the infrastructure is in place to do so. also highlights the disparity and health inequalities between Western and African Countries"
