CARPENTRY GRADUATES

15 of our trainee carpenters have just qualified for graduation. 25 students were initially enrolled, but sadly due to COVID and social distancing requirements during lockdown, the carpentry teacher Walter wasn't able to create enough space to accommodate all of them. However, his perseverance to continue their training during this time was testament to his commitment to pass on his knowledge to others, so that they can create a better life for themselves using these new skills.



One of the graduates is 27 year old Sande. Although he is deaf, his disability didn't stop him from enrolling for the carpentry scheme and he was warmly welcomed onto the programme. The Chairman for People with Disabilities attended the graduation and praised Spotlight for being one of the few organisations in the area that recognises the plight of people with disabilities and does not discriminate against them.



Onen is another graduate. He is just 14 years old and our youngest trainee. After learning that all our previous trainees are now employed, Onen decided that he too wanted to learn how to be a carpenter, so that he could get a job to support his family.



On graduating, all of the new carpenters were given tool kits. Walter told us it can often take locals ten years to acquire this sort of equipment as they simply cannot afford to buy it for themselves. But now they have the skills and the tools that they need to find work in their new trade. We wish them all the best of luck.
