The centre will provide pre, post and neonatal healthcare to mothers and babies and support safer childbirth to reduce this tragic loss of life. We are incredibly grateful to all our supporters and the Nick Maughan Foundation for helping us make our dream to build a Maternity Centre a reality.

The building is just as beautiful on the inside as its external structure. The stunning corridors give off a wonderful sense of tranquility, providing a calming energy for expectant mothers.










# FORGING LINKS - TRANSFORMING COMMUNITIES



As various equipment arrived, the different areas of the building began to evolve into their designated usage. There were birthing tables and hospital cots for the delivery suites, ...

Construction work also took place outside. The main gate entrance was completed, paving slabs leading up to the building were laid, aggregate for the walkways was compacted and drainage around the perimeter was installed.
