

### NEW MATERNITY CENTRE







After years in the planning, we are delighted to share the news that the construction of our new Maternity Centre is underway! Those of you that have been following Spotlight's journey will know that this has been a dream of ours for some time as in the Bukasakya community where we work, maternal and neo-natal death rates are amongst the highest in the world. Now, thanks to our generous donors, the Maternity Centre is a reality and will provide a much-needed health facility to reduce this tragic loss of life.

Building work began on 1st July. Shortly after the foundations were laid we welcomed the Mbale City Deputy Mayor and her team to the construction site to have a look round.



The maternity centre foundations have since been slabbed and fitted with a sewage system and the walls are now going up.
